INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this circular is to provide you with information regarding resolutions to be proposed at the Annual General Meeting relating to, among other things, (i) the re-election of retiring Directors; and (ii) the granting to the Directors of general mandate to issue Shares up to 20% of the total number of issued Shares and general mandate to buy back Shares up to 10% of the total number of issued Shares as at the date of the passing of such resolutions.

LETTER FROM THE BOARD

RE-ELECTION OF RETIRING DIRECTORS

The Board currently consists of six Directors, namely Mr. Warren Lee Wa Lun, Mr. Mark Wong Tai Chun, Mr. Arthur George Dew, Mr. Albert Ho, Mr. Peter Lee Yip Wah and Mr. Louie Chun Kit.

In accordance with Article 101 of the Articles of Association, Mr. Mark Wong Tai Chun and Mr. Albert Ho will retire by rotation and, being eligible, offer themselves for re-election at the Annual General Meeting.

Further, pursuant to the code provision of A.4.3 of the CG Code, if an independent non-executive director serves more than nine (9) years, his further appointment should be subject to a separate resolution to be approved by shareholders.

Mr. Albert Ho ("Mr. Ho") has served as an Independent Non-Executive Director for more than nine (9) years since September 2004. The Company has received from Mr. Ho an annual confirmation of independence pursuant to Rule 3.13 of the Listing Rules. Mr. Ho had or has not had any management role in the Group nor have any relationship with any Director, senior management of the Company, substantial or controlling Shareholder. The Board therefore recommends the re-election of Mr. Ho as Independent Non-Executive Director notwithstanding his length of service with the Company exceeding nine (9) years. Mr. Ho shall retire from office by rotation and, being eligible, offer himself for re-election by way of a separate resolution to be approved by the Shareholders at the Annual General Meeting.

Details of the retiring Directors who are proposed to be re-elected at the Annual General Meeting are set out in the Appendix I of this circular.

GENERAL MANDATE TO BUY BACK SHARES

At the annual general meeting of the Company held on 21st May, 2019, a general mandate was given to the Directors to exercise the powers of the Company to buy back Shares. Such mandate will lapse at the conclusion of the Annual General Meeting. The Directors propose to seek your approval of the Buy-back Resolution to be proposed at the Annual General Meeting for buy-back of Shares. An explanatory statement as required under the Share Buy-back Rules to provide the requisite information of the Buy-back Proposal is set out in the Appendix II of this circular.

GENERAL MANDATE TO ISSUE SHARES

It will also be proposed at the Annual General Meeting two ordinary resolutions as referred to in items 4(II) and 4(III) of the notice of Annual General Meeting respectively granting to the Directors a general mandate to allot, issue and deal with Shares not exceeding 20% of the total number of issued Shares as at the date of the resolution and adding to such general mandate so granted to the Directors any Shares representing the total number of Shares bought back by the Company after the granting of the general mandate to buy back up to 10% of the total number of issued Shares as at the date of the Buy-back Resolution.

ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

At the Annual General Meeting, resolutions will be proposed to the Shareholders in respect of the ordinary business of the Company to be considered at the Annual General Meeting, being the approval and adoption of the audited consolidated financial statements for the year ended 31st December, 2019, the Directors' report and the independent auditor's report, the re-election of retiring Directors and authorisation of the board to fix the remuneration of Directors, and the re-appointment of auditor and fixing its remuneration, and the special business of the Company to be considered at the Annual General Meeting, being the proposed grant of the Buy-back Proposal, the general mandate for Directors to issue new Shares and extension of general mandate to issue Shares. The notice of Annual General Meeting is set out on pages 14 to 18 of this circular.

The following are the particulars of the two retiring Directors proposed to be re-elected at the Annual General Meeting of the Company:

1. Mr. Mark Wong Tai Chun (“Mr. Wong”) – Executive Director

Mr. Wong, aged 55, was appointed as an Executive Director of the Company in December 2008. He is also an executive committee member of the Company. He has Master’s Degree in Business Administration and is a fellow of the Hong Kong Institute of Certified Public Accountants, the Association of Chartered Certified Accountants, The Chartered Governance Institute (formerly known as The Institute of Chartered Secretaries and Administrators) and The Hong Kong Institute of Chartered Secretaries. He was the financial controller of other listed companies in Hong Kong. He is also an executive director of Allied Properties (H.K.) Limited (“APL”) and the director of investment of Allied Group Limited (“AGL”), a substantial Shareholder of the Company, and an alternate director to Mr. Arthur George Dew in APAC Resources Limited (“APAC”), Tanami Gold NL (“Tanami Gold”), Dragon Mining Limited (“Dragon Mining”) and Tian An Australia Limited (“Tian An Australia”). APL, AGL, APAC and Dragon Mining are companies listed on the main board of the Stock Exchange. Tanami Gold and Tian An Australia are companies listed on the Australian Securities Exchange. He is also a director of certain subsidiaries of the Company.

Save as disclosed above, as at the Latest Practicable Date, Mr. Wong did not hold any other directorships in listed public companies during the past three years and he did not hold any other position with the Company and other members of the Group. Mr. Wong did not have any other relationship with any Director, senior management of the Company or substantial or controlling Shareholder. As at the Latest Practicable Date, he had no interests in Shares in the Company within the meaning of Part XV of the SFO.

There is no proposed length of service of Mr. Wong with the Company. He is subject to retirement by rotation and re-election in accordance with the Articles of Association. His Director’s fee is discretionary to be reviewed by the remuneration committee of the Company and determined by the Board with reference to his duties and responsibilities in the Company, the Company’s performance and the prevailing market situation and to be approved by Shareholders at any annual general meeting. For the year ended 31st December, 2019, Mr. Wong is proposed to entitle to a Director’s fee amounting to HK\$35,000 subject to Shareholders’ approval at the Annual General Meeting.

Save as disclosed above, in relation to the re-election of Mr. Wong as an Executive Director of the Company, there is no information which is discloseable nor is/was he involved in any of the matters required to be disclosed pursuant to any of the requirements of the provisions under paragraphs 13.51(2)(h) to 13.51(2)(v) of the Listing Rules, and there is no other matter which needs to be brought to the attention of Shareholders.

2. Mr. Albert Ho (“Mr. Ho”) – Independent Non-Executive Director

Mr. Ho, aged 62, appointed as an Independent Non-Executive Director of the Company in 2004. He is also the chairman of audit committee, remuneration committee and nomination committee of the Company.

Mr. Ho graduated from the Macquarie University, Sydney, Australia with a Bachelor of Economics degree in 1985 and obtained his MBA from the University of Hong Kong in 1991. He is a Certified Public Accountant of Hong Kong Institute of Certified Public Accountants and fellow member of the Association of Chartered Certified Accountants. He has extensive experience in financial and corporate management. Mr. Ho is also an independent non-executive director of Zhuhai Holdings Investment Group Limited, a company listed on the main board of the Stock Exchange.

Save as disclosed above, as at the Latest Practicable Date, Mr. Ho had not acted as director in any other listed company in the past three years and he did not hold any other position with the Company and other members of the Group.

Mr. Ho did not have any other relationship with any Director, senior management of the Company or substantial or controlling Shareholder. As at the Latest Practicable Date, he had personal interest in 2,296,000 Shares in the Company within the meaning of Part XV of the SFO.

In considering Mr. Ho’s re-election, the Board, with the assistance and recommendation from the nomination committee of the Company, has reviewed the structure, size, composition and diversity of the Board from a number of aspects, including but not limited to age, gender, nationality, length of service, and the professional experience, skills and expertise Mr. Ho can provide. The Board is of the view that during his tenure as an Independent Non-Executive Director, Mr. Ho has made positive contributions to the Company’s strategy, policies and performance with his independent advice, comments, judgment from the perspective of his financial and corporate management background coupled with his general understanding of business of the Group. He also contributes to the diversity of the Board particularly because of his expertise. He is able to devote sufficient time and attention to perform the duties as an Independent Non-Executive Director as he at present holds not more than seven listed company directorship. In view of the above, Mr. Ho’s re-election is considered to be of benefit to the Company.

Mr. Ho is appointed for a term of one and a half years and subject to retirement by rotation and re-election in accordance with the Articles of Association. His Director’s fee is discretionary to be reviewed by the remuneration committee of the Company and determined by the Board with reference to his duties and responsibilities in the Company, the Company’s performance and the prevailing market situation and to be approved by Shareholders at any annual general meeting. For the year ended 31st December, 2019, Mr. Ho is proposed to entitle to a Director’s fee amounting to HK\$138,000 subject to Shareholders’ approval at the Annual General Meeting. Mr. Ho is proposed for re-election by Shareholders at the Annual General Meeting by way of a separate resolution.

Save as disclosed above, in relation to the re-election of Mr. Ho as an Independent Non-Executive Director of the Company, there is no information which is discloseable nor is/was he involved in any of the matters required to be disclosed pursuant to any of the requirements of the provisions under paragraphs 13.51(2)(h) to 13.51(2)(v) of the Listing Rules, and there is no other matter which needs to be brought to the attention of Shareholders.

This appendix serves as an explanatory statement, as required by the Share Buy-back Rules, to provide requisite information to you for your consideration of the proposal to permit the buy-back of Shares up to a maximum of 10% of the issued Shares as at the date of the Buy-back Resolution.

This appendix also constitutes the memorandum required under Section 239(2) of the Companies Ordinance.

1. SHARES OF THE COMPANY

As at the Latest Practicable Date, the number of issued Shares was 4,111,704,320 fully paid Shares.

Subject to the passing of the Buy-back Resolution and on the basis that no further Shares are issued or bought back before the Annual General Meeting, the Company will be allowed to buy back a maximum of 411,170,432 Shares during the period ending on the earlier of the conclusion of the next annual general meeting of the Company or the date by which the next annual general meeting of the Company is required to be held by law or the date upon which such authority is revoked or varied by a resolution of the Shareholders in general meeting.

2. REASONS FOR BUY-BACK

The Directors believe that the Buy-back Proposal is in the best interests of the Company and its Shareholders. Such buy-back may, depending on market conditions and funding arrangements at the time, lead to an enhancement of the net assets and/or earnings per Share of the Company and will only be made when the Directors believe that such a buy-back will benefit the Company and its Shareholders.

3. FUNDING OF BUY-BACKS

Buy-back to be made pursuant to the proposed mandate to buy back Shares of the Company would be financed out of funds legally available for such purpose in accordance with the Company's Articles of Association and the applicable laws of Hong Kong and the Listing Rules. Such funds include, but are not limited to, profits available for distribution.

There might be an adverse impact on the working capital or gearing position of the Company as compared with the position disclosed in the audited consolidated financial statements contained in the annual report for the year ended 31st December, 2019 in the event that the general mandate pursuant to the Buy-back Proposal was to be carried out in full at any time during the proposed buy-back period. However, the Directors do not propose to exercise the general mandate pursuant to the Buy-back Proposal to such extent as would, in the circumstances, have a material adverse effect on the working capital requirements of the Company or the gearing levels which in the opinion of the Directors are from time to time appropriate for the Company.

5. UNDERTAKING

The Directors have undertaken to the Stock Exchange that they will exercise the powers of the Company to make buy-backs pursuant to the Buy-back Resolution and in accordance with the Listing Rules and the applicable laws of Hong Kong.

None of the Directors nor, to the best of their knowledge having made all reasonable enquiries, their close associates, have any present intention to sell any Shares to the Company under the Buy-back Proposal if such is approved by the Shareholders.

No other core connected persons (as defined in the Listing Rules) have notified the Company that they have a present intention to sell Shares to the Company, or have undertaken not to do so, in the event that the Buy-back Proposal is approved by the Shareholders.

6. TAKEOVERS CODE

If on the exercise of the power to buy back Shares pursuant to the Buy-back Proposal, a Shareholder's proportionate interest in the voting rights of the Company increases, such increase will be treated as an acquisition for the purposes of Rule 32 of the Takeovers Code. As a result, a Shareholder or group of Shareholders acting in concert could obtain or consolidate control of the Company and become obliged to make a mandatory offer in accordance with Rules 26 and 32 of the Takeovers Code.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, Allied Group Limited ("AGL") is interested in 3,082,889,606 Shares, representing approximately 74.97% of issued Shares, as recorded in the register of interests and short positions kept under Part XV of the SFO. These 3,082,889,606 Shares are held by Bright Clear Limited ("Bright Clear") which is an indirect wholly-owned subsidiary of AGL. AGL was therefore deemed to have an interest in these Shares in which Bright Clear was interested.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, Mr. Lee Seng Hui, Ms. Lee Su Hwei and Mr. Lee Seng Huang are the trustees of Lee and Lee Trust, being a discretionary trust. The Lee and Lee Trust controlled approximately 74.95% interest of the issued shares of AGL (inclusive of Mr. Lee Seng Hui's personal interests) and was therefore deemed to have an interest in the Shares in which AGL was interested.

Based on such interest in the Shares and in the event that the Directors exercise in full the power to buy back Shares under the Buy-back Proposal and assuming that no further Shares are issued or bought back prior to the Annual General Meeting, the interest of Lee and Lee Trust and the parties acting in concert with it (including AGL) will be increased to approximately 83.31% of the issued Shares.

The Directors are not aware of any consequences which may arise under the Takeovers Code as a result of any buy-backs made under the Buy-back Proposal. The Directors have no present intention to exercise the power to buy back Shares pursuant to the Buy-back Proposal to such extent as would result in such takeover obligation. The Directors have no immediate intention to buy back Shares to the extent that will result in the amount of Shares held by the public being reduced to 25% if the Buy-back Proposal is approved at the Annual General Meeting.
