**INTRODUCTION**

The purpose of this circular is to provide you with information regarding resolutions to be proposed at the Annual General Meeting relating to, among other things, (i) the re-election of retiring Directors; and (ii) the granting to the Directors of general mandate to issue Shares up to 20% of the Company's issued share capital and general mandate to repurchase Shares up to 10% of the Company's issued share capital as at the date of the passing of such resolutions.

## LETTER FROM THE BOARD

### RE-ELECTION OF RETIRING DIRECTORS

The Board currently consists of seven Directors, namely Mr. Warren Lee Wa Lun, Mr. Mark Wong Tai Chun, Mr. Arthur George Dew, Mr. Peter Lee Yip Wah, Dr. Ambrose So Shu Fai, Mr. Albert Ho and Mr. Louie Chun Kit.

In accordance with Article 101 of the Articles of Association, Mr. Mark Wong Tai Chun and Mr. Peter Lee Yip Wah retire by rotation and, being eligible, offer themselves for re-election at the Annual General Meeting.

In accordance with Article 92 of the Company's Articles of Association, Mr. Louie Chun Kit will retire and being eligible, offer himself for re-election at the Annual General Meeting.

Details of the retiring Directors who are proposed to be re-elected at the Annual General Meeting are set out in the Appendix I of this circular.

### GENERAL MANDATE TO REPURCHASE SHARES

At the annual general meeting of the Company held on 4th June, 2010, a general mandate was given to the Directors to exercise the powers of the Company to repurchase Shares. Such mandate will lapse at the conclusion of the Annual General Meeting. The Directors propose to seek your approval of the Repurchase Resolution to be proposed at the Annual General Meeting for repurchase of Shares. An explanatory statement as required under the Share Buy Back Rules to provide the requisite information of the Repurchase Proposal is set out in the Appendix II of this circular.

### GENERAL MANDATE TO ISSUE SHARES

It will also be proposed at the Annual General Meeting two ordinary resolutions as referred to in items 4(II) and 4(III) of the notice of the Annual General Meeting respectively granting to the Directors a general mandate to allot, issue and deal with Shares not exceeding 20% of the issued share capital of the Company as at the date of the resolution and adding to such general mandate so granted to the Directors any Shares representing the aggregate nominal amount of the Shares repurchased by the Company after the granting of the general mandate to repurchase up to 10% of the issued share capital of the Company as at the date of the Repurchase Resolution.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, the issued share capital of the Company comprised 4,095,669,118 Shares.

Subject to the passing of the ordinary resolution as referred to in item 4(II) of the notice of the Annual General Meeting and on the basis that no further Shares are issued or repurchased prior to the Annual General Meeting, the Company would be allowed to allot, issue and deal with a maximum of 819,133,823 Shares representing not more than 20% of the issued share capital of the Company at the Latest Practicable Date.

### ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

At the Annual General Meeting, resolutions will be proposed to the Shareholders in respect of the ordinary business of the Company to be considered at the Annual General Meeting, being the approval and adoption of the audited financial statements for the year ended 31st December, 2010, the Directors' report and the independent auditor's report, the re-election of Directors and authorisation of the board to fix the remuneration of Directors, and the re-appointment of auditor and fixing their remuneration, and the special business of the Company to be considered at the Annual General Meeting, being the proposed grant of the Repurchase Proposal, the general mandate for Directors to issue new Shares and extension of general mandate to issue Share. The notice of Annual General Meeting is set out on pages 13 to 16 of this circular.

Pursuant to the Listing Rules, any vote of Shareholders taken at the Annual General Meeting to approve the above resolutions proposed must be taken by poll.

### ACTION TO BE TAKEN

A proxy form for use at the Annual General Meeting is enclosed herein. Whether or not you are able to attend the Annual General Meeting, you are recommended to complete the proxy form and return it to the share registrar of the Company, Tricor Secretaries Limited, 26th Floor, Tesbury Centre, 28 Queen's Road East, Hong Kong not less than 48 hours before the time appointed for holding the Annual General Meeting. Completion and return of the proxy form will not prevent Shareholders of the Company from attending and voting at the Annual General Meeting if they so wish.

### RECOMMENDATION

The Directors believe that all resolutions set out in the notice of Annual General Meeting are all in the best interests of the Company and its Shareholders. Accordingly, the Directors recommend that all Shareholders of the Company should vote in favour of the resolutions set out in the notice of Annual General Meeting as the Directors intend to do so themselves in respect of their own holdings.

The followings are the particulars of the three retiring Directors proposed to be re-elected at the Annual General Meeting of the Company:

**1. Mr. Mark Wong Tai Chun (“Mr. Wong”)**

Mr. Wong, aged 46, was appointed as an Executive Director of the Company in December 2008. He is also an executive committee member of the Company. He has a Master’s Degree in Business Administration and is a fellow of the Hong Kong Institute of Certified Public Accountants, the Association of Chartered Certified Accountants, The Institute of Chartered Secretaries and Administrators and The Hong Kong Institute of Chartered Secretaries. He was the financial controller of other listed companies in Hong Kong. He is also an executive director of Allied Overseas Limited (“AOL”, formerly known as Quality HealthCare Asia Limited) and was appointed the chief executive officer of AOL in November 2010. He is also an executive director of Allied Properties (H.K.) Limited (“APL”) and the director of investment of Allied Group Limited (“AGL”), a substantial Shareholder. AOL, APL and AGL are listed companies on the main board of the Stock Exchange.

Save as disclosed above, Mr. Wong does not hold any other directorships in listed public companies during the past three years and he does not hold any other position with the Company and other members of the Group nor have any other relationship with any Director, senior management or substantial or controlling Shareholder. As at the Latest Practicable Date, he had no interest in Shares in the Company within the meaning of Part XV of the SFO.

There is no proposed length of service of Mr. Wong with the Company. He is subject to retirement and re-election provisions in the Articles of Association. His Director’s fee is discretionary to be proposed by the Board with reference to his duties and responsibilities in the Company, the Company’s performance and the prevailing market situation and to be approved by Shareholders at any annual general meeting. For the year ended 31st December, 2010, Mr. Wong is proposed to entitle to a Director’s fee amounting to HK\$20,000 subject to Shareholders’ approval at the Annual General Meeting.

Save as disclosed above, in relation to the re-election of Mr. Wong as an Executive Director of the Company, there is no information which is discloseable nor is/was he involved in any of the matters required to be disclosed pursuant to any of the requirements of the provisions under paragraphs 13.51(2)(h) to 13.51(2)(v) of the Listing Rules, and there is no other matter which needs to be brought to the attention of Shareholders.



**2. Mr. Peter Lee Yip Wah (“Mr. Lee”)**

Mr. Lee, aged 68, joined the Group in 1998. He is now a Non-Executive Director of the Company. Mr. Lee is a solicitor in Hong Kong. He is also an independent non-executive director of China Merchants Holdings (International) Company Limited and Sinotrans Shipping Limited, both being companies listed on the main board of the Stock Exchange.

Mr. Lee was a graduate of the University of Hong Kong. He was a practicing solicitor and was a consultant of Messrs. Woo Kwan Lee & Lo. He was admitted as a solicitor in Hong Kong in 1971, in England in 1974 and in Singapore in 1995. He was appointed as a China Appointed Attesting Officer in Beijing in 1993. He has over 35 years' experience in the management and company secretarial fields.

Mr. Lee retired as a non-executive director of Shenzhen Investment Limited (a listed public company in Hong Kong) on 2nd June 2008. Save as aforesaid, Mr. Lee had not acted as director in any other listed company in the last three years and he does not hold any other position with the Company and other members of the Group.

Mr. Lee does not have any other relationship with any Director, senior management or substantial or controlling Shareholder. As at the Latest Practicable Date, he has personal interest in 3,410,000 Shares within the meaning of Part XV of the SFO.

Mr. Lee is appointed for a term of one year and subject to retirement by rotation and re-election in accordance with the Articles of Association. His Director's fee is discretionary to be proposed by the Board with reference to his duties and responsibilities in the Company, the Company's performance and the prevailing market situation and to be approved by Shareholders at any annual general meeting. For the year ended 31st December, 2010, Mr. Lee is proposed to entitle to a Director's fee amounting to HK\$20,000 subject to Shareholders' approval at the Annual General Meeting.

In relation to the re-election of Mr. Lee as a Non-Executive Director of the Company, save as disclosed above, there is no information which is discloseable nor is/was he involved in any of the matters required to be disclosed pursuant to any of the requirements of the provisions under paragraphs 13.51(2)(h) to 13.51(2)(v) of the Listing Rules, and there is no other matter which needs to be brought to the attention of Shareholders.

**3. Mr. Louie Chun Kit (“Mr. Louie”)**

Mr. Louie, aged 46, was appointed an Independent Non- Executive Director and member of audit committee and remuneration committee of the Company in August 2010. He is a practising accountant. He is a fellow member of Hong Kong Institute of Certified Public Accountants and a fellow member of the Association of Chartered Certified Accountants. He is currently the chief accountant of Yield Limited, a Hong Kong private company engaged in property development in the People’s Republic of China. Prior to his present position in November 2006, he spent over 10 years as the chief accountant in Yu Ming Investment Management Limited, the investment manager of the Company and around 5 years in the audit practice with an international accounting firm in Hong Kong. He holds a diploma in accounting from Lingnan College in 1988 and a master degree in business systems from Monash University of Australia in 2005. He is also an independent non-executive director of Manta Holdings Company Limited, a company listed on the Stock Exchange.

Save as disclosed above, Mr. Louie does not hold any other directorships in listed public companies during the past three years and he does not hold any other position with the Company and other members of the Group nor have any other relationship with any Director, senior management or substantial or controlling Shareholder. As at the Latest Practicable Date, he had no interest in Shares in the Company within the meaning of Part XV of the SFO.

Mr. Louie is appointed for a term of one year and subject to retirement by rotation and re-election in accordance with the Articles of Association. His Director’s fee is discretionary to be proposed by the Board with reference to his duties and responsibilities in the Company, the Company’s performance and the prevailing market situation and to be approved by Shareholders at any annual general meeting. For the year ended 31st December, 2010, Mr. Louie is proposed to entitle to a Director’s fee amounting to HK\$24,547.94 subject to Shareholders’ approval at the Annual General Meeting.

In relation to the re-election of Mr. Louie as an Independent Non-Executive Director of the Company, save as disclosed above, there is no information which is discloseable nor is/was he involved in any of the matters required to be disclosed pursuant to any of the requirements of the provisions under paragraphs 13.51(2)(h) to 13.51(2)(v) of the Listing Rules, and there is no other matter which needs to be brought to the attention of Shareholders.

This appendix serves as an explanatory statement, as required by the Share Buy Back Rules, to provide requisite information to you for your consideration of the proposal to permit the repurchase of Shares up to a maximum of 10% of the issued share capital of the Company as at the date of the Repurchase Resolution.

This appendix also constitutes the memorandum required under Section 49BA(3) of the Companies Ordinance.

### **1. SHARE CAPITAL**

As at the Latest Practicable Date, the issued share capital of the Company was HK\$409,566,911.80 divided into 4,095,669,118 full paid Shares.

Subject to the passing of the Repurchase Resolution and on the basis that no further Shares are issued or repurchased before the Annual General Meeting, the Company will be allowed to repurchase a maximum of 409,566,911 Shares during the period ending on the earlier of the conclusion of the next annual general meeting of the Company or the date by which the next annual general meeting of the Company is required to be held by law or the date upon which such authority is revoked or varied by a resolution of the Shareholders in general meeting.

### **2. REASONS FOR REPURCHASE**

The Directors believe that the Repurchase Proposal is in the best interests of the Company and its Shareholders. Such repurchase may, depending on market conditions and funding arrangements at the time, lead to an enhancement of the net assets and/or earnings per Share of the Company and will only be made when the Directors believe that such a repurchase will benefit the Company and its Shareholders.

### **3. FUNDING OF REPURCHASES**

Repurchase to be made pursuant to the proposed mandate to repurchase Shares of the Company would be financed out of funds legally available for such purpose in accordance with the Company's memorandum of association and the Articles of Association and the applicable laws of Hong Kong and the Listing Rules. Such funds include, but are not limited to, profits available for distribution.

There might be an adverse impact on the working capital or gearing position of the Company as compared with the position disclosed in the audited accounts contained in the annual report for the year ended 31st December, 2010 in the event that the general mandate pursuant to the Repurchase Proposal was to be carried out in full at any time during the proposed repurchase period. However, the Directors do not propose to exercise the general mandate pursuant to the Repurchase Proposal to such extent as would, in the circumstances, have a material adverse effect on the working capital requirements of the Company or the gearing levels which in the opinion of the Directors are from time to time appropriate for the Company.

#### 5. UNDERTAKING

The Directors have undertaken to the Stock Exchange that they will exercise the powers of the Company to make repurchases pursuant to the Repurchase Resolution and in accordance with the Listing Rules and the applicable laws of Hong Kong.

None of the Directors nor, to the best of their knowledge having made all reasonable enquiries, their associates, have any present intention to sell any Shares to the Company under the Repurchase Proposal if such is approved by the Shareholders.

No other connected persons (as defined in the Listing Rules) have notified the Company that they have a present intention to sell Shares to the Company, or have undertaken not to do so, in the event that the Repurchase Proposal is approved by the Shareholders.

## 6. TAKEOVERS CODE

If on the exercise of the power to repurchase Shares pursuant to the Repurchase Proposal, a Shareholder's proportionate interest in the voting rights of the Company increases, such increase will be treated as an acquisition for the purposes of Rule 32 of the Takeovers Code. As a result, a Shareholder or group of Shareholders acting in concert could obtain or consolidate control of the Company and become obliged to make a mandatory offer in accordance with Rules 26 and 32 of the Takeovers Code. As at the Latest Practicable Date, the interests of Lee and Lee Trust and parties acting in concert with it are listed below:-

3. Mr. Lee Seng Hui, Ms. Lee Su Hwei and Mr. Lee Seng Huang are the trustees of Lee and Lee Trust, being a discretionary trust. They together owned approximately 53.32% interest of the issued share capital of AGL and were therefore deemed to have an interest in the Shares in which AGL was interested.

Based on such interest in the Shares and in the event that the Directors exercise in full the power to repurchase Shares under the Repurchase Proposal and assuming that no further Shares are issued or repurchased prior to the Annual General Meeting, the interest of Lee and Lee Trust and the parties acting in concert with it (including AGL) will be increased to approximately 80.10% of the issued share capital of the Company.

The Directors are not aware of any consequences which may arise under the Takeovers Code as a result of any repurchases made under the Repurchase Proposal. The Directors have no present intention to exercise the power to repurchase Shares pursuant to the Repurchase Proposal to such extent as would result in such takeover obligation. The Directors have no immediate intention to repurchase Shares to the extent that will result in the amount of Shares held by the public being reduced to 25% if the Repurchase Proposal is approved at the Annual General Meeting.

**7. SHARE REPURCHASE MADE BY THE COMPANY**

The Company has not repurchased any Shares (whether on the Stock Exchange or otherwise) in the six months preceding the Latest Practicable Date.

  - (i) the conclusion of the next annual general meeting of the Company;
  - (ii) the expiration of the period within which the next annual general meeting of the Company is required by law to be held; or
  - (iii) the date on which the authority set out in this Resolution is revoked or varied by an ordinary resolution of the Shareholders of the Company in general meeting.”
